

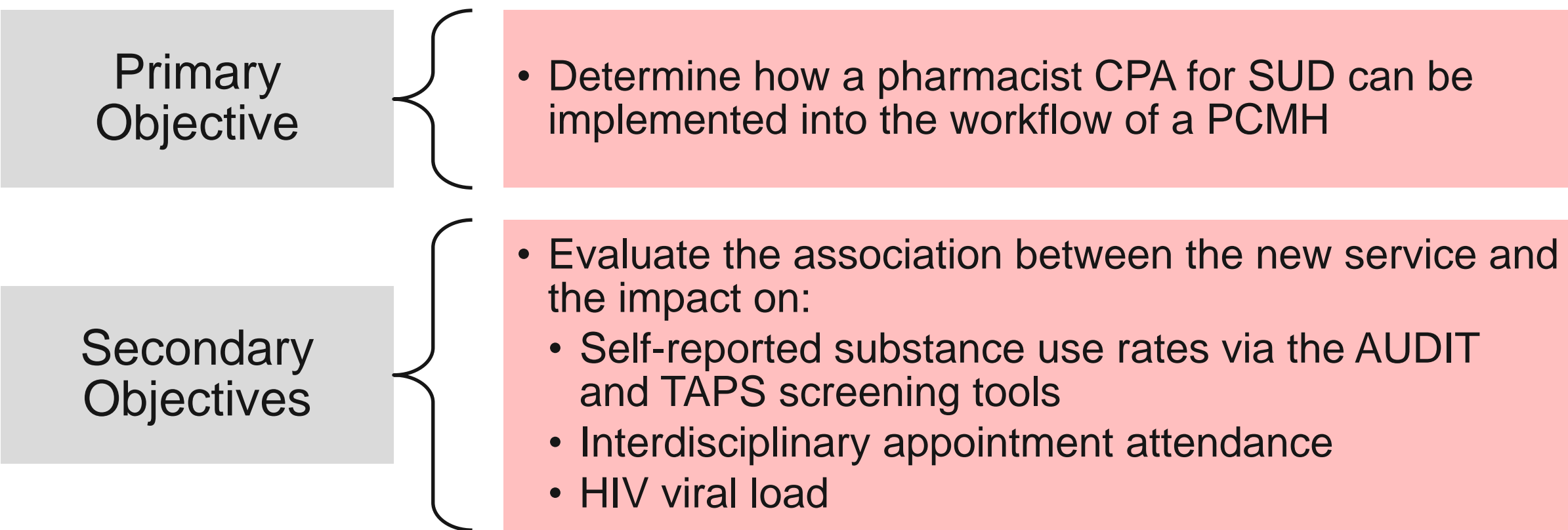


Multidisciplinary Management of Substance Use Disorder in People Living with HIV treated in a Medical Home Model of Care

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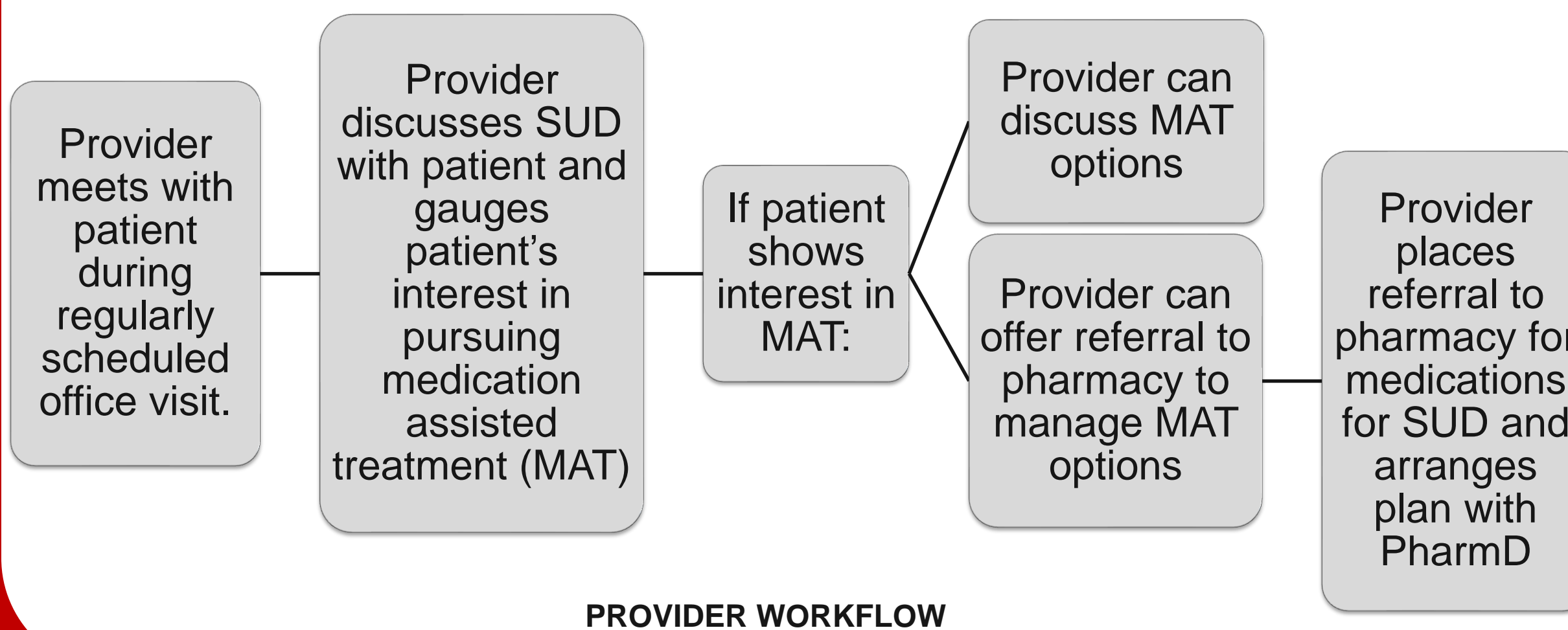
Background

- People living with Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) commonly suffer from concurrent substance use disorder (SUD)
- Shortage of behavioral health providers in Wisconsin¹
- Collaborative care models between physicians and pharmacists have been successful for opioid-dependent patients²
- Gap in access to SUD treatment creates an opportunity for new SUD CPA for pharmacists



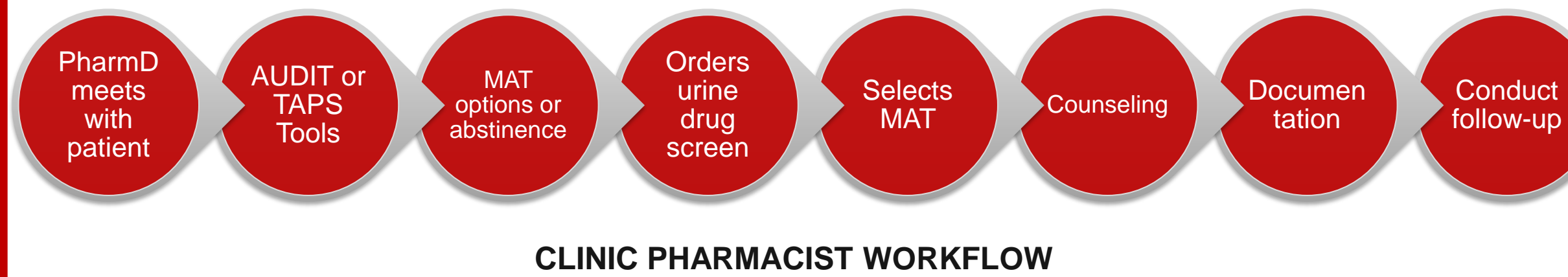

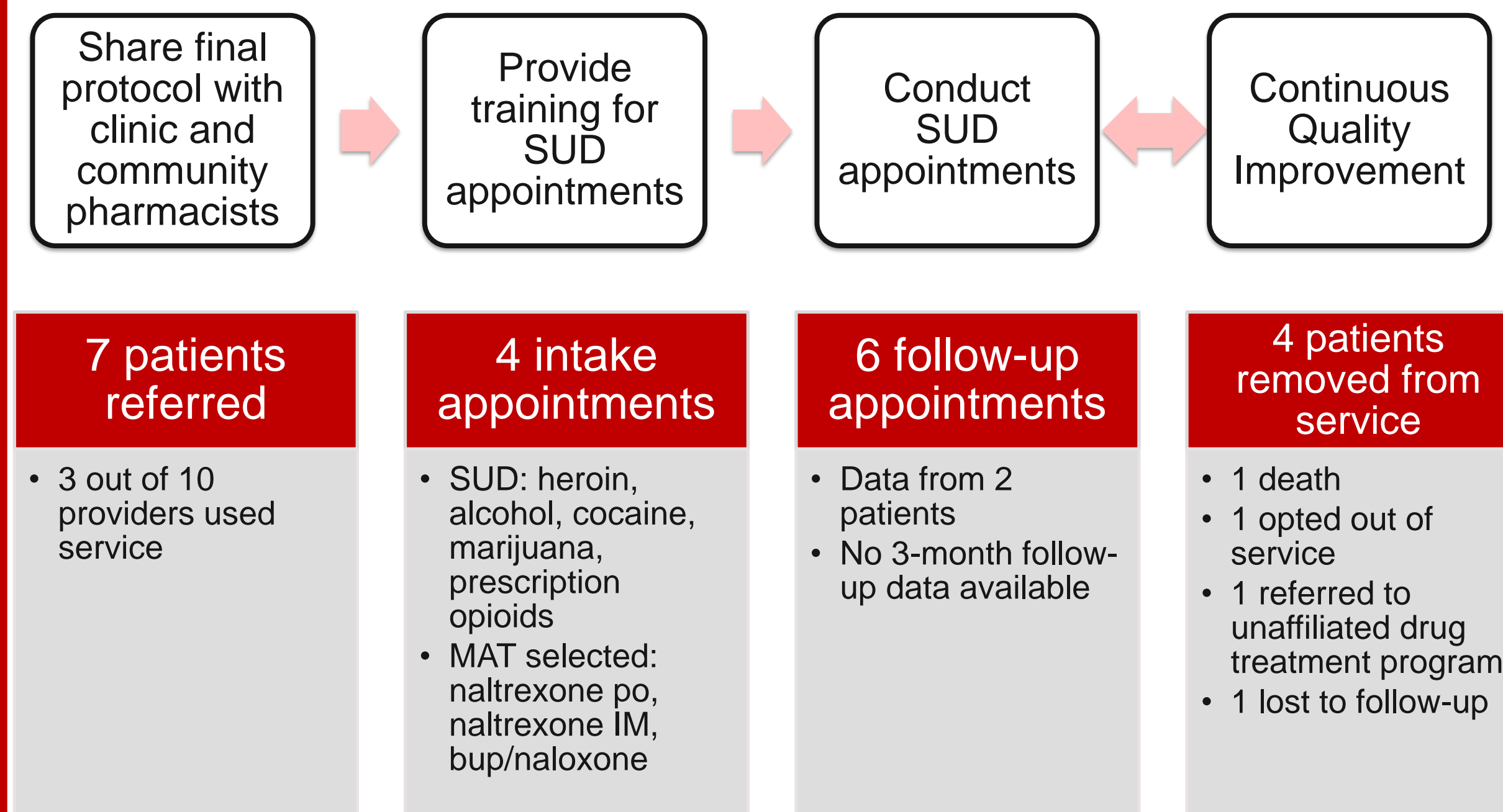

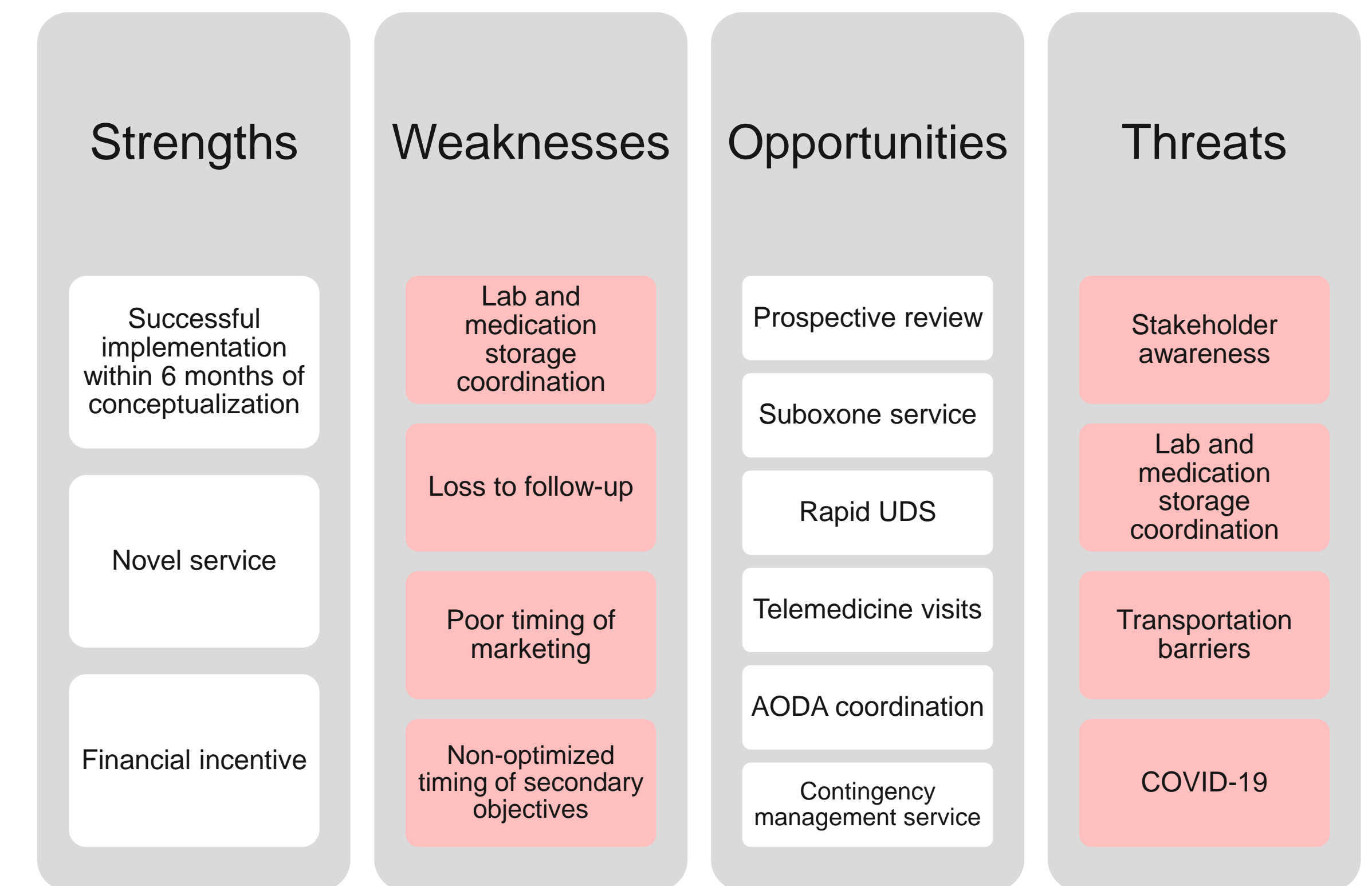

Results from the initial patient referrals and stakeholder survey indicate that integrating the pharmacist into the PCMH team for collaborative SUD treatment has been effectively implemented.
